They managed to make 111 pieces altogether so they actually exceeded the challenge - well done to everyone involved!

They had to buy the same toys from different shops with a budget of £100. They then collected the information and developed spread sheets. They then used Excel to make graphs, and the formula function to total the price of the toys. This

The purpose of the week is to encourage reading for pleasure.


All classes will base their work for the week on a core book:
